Minister's Message

On 20th January, Donald Trump was inaugurated as US President. For a second times, he became, arguably, the most powerful person on the planet. It would take a brave person to speak truth to his power.

Enter the Right Reverend Mariann Budde, the Episcopal Bishop of Washington. As she closed her sermon, she made issued a challenge to Trump:

'Let me make one final plea, Mr. President. Millions have put their trust in you and, as you told the nation yesterday, you have felt the providential hand of a loving God. In the name of our God, I ask you to have mercy upon the people in our country who are scared now.'

As the bishop continued, she spoke of the gay, lesbian and transgender communities, some of whom now fear for their lives. She mentioned migrant workers, who pay taxes and are good citizens, but who fear for their livelihoods due to lack of proper documentation. She spoke of those fleeing warzones and seeking sanctuary.

No doubt, there are many in the UK who also face those challenges. Will we, followers of Jesus, be people who also speak truth to power? Will we be those who embody the love and compassion of Jesus? It may cost us, but when it does we remember that it cost Jesus everything!

I end this reflection with the closing words of Right Rev Budd's sermon:

'Our God teaches us that we are to be merciful to the stranger, for we were all once strangers in this land. May God grant us the strength and courage to honour the dignity of every human being, to speak the truth to one another in love and walk humbly with each other and our God for the good of all people. Good of all people in this nation and the world. Amen.'
