God save the King!

Probably, you remember where you were when you heard news of the Queen's death. News of such significance tends to have that effect. Wendy and I were in the car, on our way out to a restaurant, in Buckingham. The meal was lovely, but the atmosphere was a little sombre.

As the nation digested the news, and plans were unveiled, we decided to go to London as the Queen's body travelled from Buckingham Palace to Westminster Palace, where she would lie in state. It was a moving experience to be there amongst the crowd of mourners, not least as the Queen's coffin came by, resplendent with the Royal Standard and completed by the orb, sceptre and the Imperial State Crown.

This crown was worn by the Queen after her coronation, and on various special and state occasions. Apparently, it contains 2,868 diamonds, 17 sapphires, 11 emeralds, four rubies, and 269 pearls. It is said to be worth between £3 billion and £5 billion! If anything is a symbol of royal importance, this is it.

Whether you a royalist or republican or somewhere in between, there is no doubting the sincerity of the Queen's Christian faith. She was anointed with oil at her coronation, and she believed herself anointed to be Queen by God's Holy Spirit. She was Queen, but she understood her life as a gift to be given back to the King of kings. Can there have been any more poignant sign of this than the hymn she chose for her funeral, with its final verse:



Finish then thy new creation: pure and spotless let us be;
Let us see your great salvation, perfect in eternity: changed from glory into glory till in heaven we take our place, till we cast our crowns before you, lost in wonder, love and praise!

In many ways, we are not like the Queen, but in many we are. We, too, have lives as a gift from God to be given back to the King of kings. We may not have an earthly crown, but all who love the Lord are promised the 'crown of life' (James 1:12) that we will lay before the throne of God (Rev 4:10).

God save the King! Glory to the King of kings!
