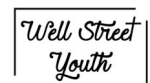

Minister's Message

As the Church around the world enters the season of Advent, like many churches, we at Well Street will be lighting candles as we look forward to Christmas. On the first Sunday in Advent, the candle represents 'hope', on the second 'peace', on the third 'joy' and on the fourth 'love'. On Christmas Day, we shall light a fifth candle representing the birth of Jesus.

This year, in the place of Jesus' birth, celebrations will be somewhat muted. Candles around the star on the spot where many believe Jesus was born will remain unlit in memory of all those who have been killed in the current conflict. Our Church denominations invite us to leave our second Advent candle unlit through Advent, in solidarity with all who are suffering in the Holy Land.



Even in the absence of peace in our world, we can find hope, joy and love because of the Saviour, Jesus Christ. We remember too that he is our 'Prince of Peace' (Isaiah 9:6), and we pray for that peace to be made known in our world and experienced in our lives.

'May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.'
